Pope Francis: From the homily given by Pope Francis at Vespers of Holy Mary Mother of God on New Year's Eve

"Is human fraternity just another slogan, or can it be built on a solid foundation?" Mary the Mother of God gives us the answer by showing us Jesus.

The hope of a fraternal world is the Word made flesh, the incarnate Son, sent by a loving Father, so that we may become his children and be brothers and sisters among ourselves. While we admire the many works which have been completed to help us to celebrate the Jubilee, we must also recognise the building site in each one of us where we allow God to change and make better that which is unworthy of a son or daughter of his. Let us every day commit ourselves to living as a brother or sister to my neighbour. May Mary, our Holy Mother help us to walk together as pilgrims of hope, on a path to fraternity. "

Fr John adds: Next weekend we have our tea and coffee after Mass. It is not always well supported as many parishioners seem to be in a hurry to get away after Mass is ended. Of course, I understand there are many valid reasons why we sometimes need to get away but surely not every time. I do appeal to you to make an effort to use these opportunities to socialise, not just among old friends but also to welcome the new faces. I think the same could be said about after mass when parishioners are in a great haste to leave without any greeting to their neighbours in church. Many new parishioners have commented on how unwelcome they feel when they come to church, even parishioners who have attended mass for many years have said how people ignored them for the first few years The church is a family and is where we meet as a family, as Pope Francis mentions in his homily above. We need to remember that Christ is present in the lonely and the lost, as well as in the familiar and the loved. We are generous to people in need who live thousands of miles away but sometimes unable to offer the gift of friendship to our parish community closer to home.
