Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord – 13th April



Dear Parishioners.

Palm Sunday today heralds the beginning of Holy Week with the description of the Passion as it is narrated for us by our readers. There are no longer any parts for the congregation and I have to admit that I am not sorry. I always felt it was wrong of us to take the part of those who wanted Jesus to die, the same crowd who on Palm Sunday welcomed Jesus as he arrived in Jerusalem. Having said this perhaps the crowds who welcomed Jesus with Palms as their Messiah but days later called for his death do represent us in our sinfulness. One moment we can be thinking about our faith and how we plan to imitate Christ and the next minute we are berating our neighbour for some minor crime or misdemeanour which has upset us. One moment we are loving God with all our mind, heart and soul and the next we have turned our back on him. It is, I suppose, the flow of humanity which Adam and Eve established by choosing to listen to the devil and disobey God. This is our fatal flaw but in Jesus we have our true Messiah and Saviour who by his death and resurrection from the dead breaks or even smashes the control of the devil and as he rises from the dead he leads us to the new life of heaven.

This week those stages of the Passion of Christ are replayed in slow motion and we his disciples attend these holy services to watch, listen and show Jesus how much we love him for what he has given us. Think of the words from scripture, "by his wounds you have been healed." For in his passion, death and resurrection Jesus gives us life and it is this new life we celebrate on Easter Sunday.

This week the Church provides for each member a ringside seat. In the Penitential Service on Tuesday evening we are invited to repent and receive a new life of Christ through his gift of forgiveness. Not receiving this gift of the Lord we deny ourselves an opportunity of grace so we should see this sacrament as our ticket to the life of Christ.

On Holy Thursday Christ gave the disciples the gift of his Body and Blood at the Last Supper and said do this in memory of me. It is a beautiful story of friendship. On Good Friday we hear the Passion of the evangelist John. In this version, Jesus fulfils his mission, "It is accomplished," by obeying the will of God, the Father. This is why we call this Friday "Good" Friday because on this day Jesus has won our salvation.

The Easter Vigil is the story of our salvation from the beginning of time. It is the revelation of God who so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that it might be saved. Flawed humanity receives the gift of life which is that moment when the light of Christ appears in the darkness. In a darkened Church the light of the candles is fantastic and moving experience as the life which Christ gives to us is revealed in the water of Baptism, the Word of God, the Sacraments and Eucharist.

Sadly many parishioners only attend on Easter Sunday. I am sure you have your own reasons for this but I cannot think of anything that would be more important than showing solidarity with the person who sacrificed his life for us. It is the bond which we receive in our Baptism, and invitation by God to become a member of his family. Here at St George and St Teresa's Church we are the members of the family. I look forwards to seeing you at the Holy Week Services, not as the crowd calling for crucifixion but as loyal members of God's family.
