Dear Parishioners.

Last week I attended a Synod for Priests at a conference centre in Leamington. The title was "The Joy of the Priesthood". Over a hundred priests from around the Diocese discussed the challenges of priesthood in 2024. In randomly formed discussion groups of seven priests we were given 3 minutes each to present our views. It was good to listen as we shared our thoughts and experiences. Over a period of 3 days from Tuesday to Thursday we prayed and reflected on our ministry. By the end we all felt renewed and refocussed for the challenges to come.

Last weekend I asked you to choose a time between 8.45am and 11am for a single Sunday Mass during the summer. I haven't yet looked at the results. I do hope you will think not only about what is most convenient for you but what is best for us all. As my recent conference experience reminds me, we must embrace change however difficult and challenging it is.

Speaking of change I want to tell you that our two parish catechists Isabel and Christine have retired after 30 years of giving instructions for First Holy Communion and Confirmation. They have prepared hundreds of children for these Sacraments and on behalf of the parish I thank them for their generosity. Now we have no catechists for these Sacraments and I ask you to pray with me for another generous soul or a group of generous souls to offer an hour a week during term time in the run up to the Sacrament to share their faith. There are many resources available. Please listen hard for the voice of the Lord as he calls each one of us to share our faith and build his Church.

Many thanks also to our school catechists who prepared 28 children for their First Holy Communion. It was a joyful Mass and also the following day on Sunday morning for the Thanksgiving Mass.

The weather next weekend for our Summer Party is going to be warm according to the long-range forecast with temperatures of 21 degrees C on 23rd June. I look forward to seeing you.

Longer range dates for your diary (as I mentioned at Mass last weekend) 2025 will be the 90th anniversary of the building of St George and St Teresa of the Child Jesus Catholic Church. It is also a Jubilee Year in the Church. Let us prepare to celebrate everything the Church has given us, what we have received and what we are called to give.
