Dear Parishioners,

Last week I attended several meetings on behalf of the parish. On Monday evening (on my day off) the Churches Together in Knowle, Dorridge and Bentley Heath met at the Dorridge Methodist Church in Mill Road. The meeting reviewed joint events since last October. I am grateful to Deacon's Stephen and Subhi for representing us at these services. The pulpit swap for Christian unity week was well received by the participating churches. There will be pancakes at the Methodist Church at their afternoon tea party on Shrove Tuesday. There will be a joint service to reaffirm the Covenant on Sunday 12th October at the URC church in Station Road. I can vouch for their warm hospitality and chocolate biscuits. We all liked the idea of a Passion Play for Easter 2026. Some churches will be running a Lent discussion meeting. There are hopes for an Eco talk and a request for speakers. The next Churches Together meeting is on 18th June.

The Deanery Meeting on Tuesday last week saw the parishes in Birmingham North and East meet at Olton Friary. We were reminded that the churches in our cluster (Dorridge, Shirley, Solihull, and Olton Friary) need to work together on achieving the Diocesan vision of **Evangelisation, Formation, Liturgy and Worship** and **Social Outreach**. With a focus on *young people and families, Co-responsibility,* and *care for creation*. The question is how? We shall also be soon needing representatives from the laity to participate in discussions concerning the future for our churches.

Before the next Deanery meeting in March our cluster (clergy meeting together) will be required to propose which properties to keep and which to dispose of, or repurpose in terms of our presbyteries, churches, and parish halls. Deciding factors will be where a parish is operating at a deficit, where property and energy costs cannot be met, where repairs of properties is higher than a parish can afford, where Sunday attendance is less than one hundred. Other considerations are the declining number of clergy, if the parish lose their priest he might not be replaced. The good news is we are not in any of these categories. Our task is to grow the parish and remain self-supporting and sustainable. Some more good news is the SVP Tea Party next Wednesday. It is always a very enjoyable afternoon.
