Dear Parishioners,

Today is the last Sunday of the liturgical year which began in Advent 2023. As this year draws to a close we think about how our faith has helped us to navigate the path of life. As we look back we see how the fears were overcome, the high points were enjoyed, the memories were formed. We have much to be thankful for as we reach the pinnacle of our liturgical year and so our Mass this Sunday reflects our desire to thank God for sending us his Son to be our Good Shepherd and loving Saviour.

Today is also National Youth Sunday. In the diocese we have the support of the Birmingham Catholic Youth Service BCYS who advise, encourage and lead our young people, as well as clergy, faith leaders and youth leaders. The Kenelm Youth Trust (KYT) administers Alton Castle and provides events for children throughout the diocese. Our Catholic primary school provides a good education and helps to raise our children in the practice of the faith. In our own church, we have Children's Liturgy at the 8.45am Mass on Sunday during term time. Our catechism classes run on Saturday mornings for the children who are not at a Catholic school. Last year we started a Youth SVP group which challenges members to put their faith into action through working on social justice issues.

Every parish is a family of believers. Every family depends on its members to be active in prayer, social activity and Christian charity. As St Francis said, "it is by giving that we receive". Please consider how you, dear reader, can be active in your faith. Over the past year we have lost some volunteers and benefactors. I am grateful for your generosity but mindful of the true cost of discipleship. We need people to be generous with their time. We need altar servers, church cleaners, volunteers to help with children's liturgy, musicians and singers, a volunteer to help with the catechism class, members for the Youth SVP. Every person needs to think: What can I do to help?

Congratulations and celebrations to Ian Morgan and Damien Walmsley who receive an Ubi Caritas award during the 10.30am Mass today in thanksgiving for their help with the work of the Ethnic Chaplaincy led by Mgr McHugh. He will present the award and concelebrate this Mass.
