Dear Parishioners.

This weekend the clocks will have been put forward one hour for those of you who are reading this newsletter during the sermon on Sunday morning will know! We shall lose an hour but having said this the weather forecast for next week is set fair and Easter is now within our sights. Today is Laetare Sunday (rose vestments – not pink!) and Mother's Day, or as a priest once corrected, me Mothering Sunday! Last Tuesday we celebrated the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord on 25th March and all being well this means a perfect nine months until Christmas Day 25th December.

During Lent one of the causes of anxiety for many of us is the thought of having to go to confession. (Guilty conscience?) We shall be hosting the Cluster Penitential Service and Confessions on Tuesday 15th April at 7pm in the church but why wait until then? The school is getting in early. Our First Holy Communion Class from were excellently prepared for their special Sacrament and twenty-seven children were blessed with God's Grace of forgiveness last Tuesday afternoon. Next week I shall be hearing the confessions of the children from Year Four to Year Six which is a minimum of seventy-five children. I would like to encourage you, dear reader, to make proper preparation for Holy Week and Easter by to attending Confession. As the weather forecast for the next week looks so good, I propose to open the church from 6-7pm every day Monday to Friday, there will be Exposition (as part of our 24 hours for the Lord) and an opportunity to drop in and make your peace with the Lord. I hope you will avail yourselves of this opportunity. The other times are 9.15 to 9.45am on Saturday and 4-5pm Sunday with a Holy Hour and 5pm Stations of the Cross. I expect there will be a few of you who are not certain what to do, so I will put out instructions for an examination of conscience and all the words you have to say for a good confession.

Next weekend 5th/6th April there will be a special one-off collection for the National Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham. This has been agreed by the Bishops of England and Wales to support the administration and development of the Shrine. Having recently visited Walsingham on a clergy retreat I can see there is a lack of financial support for this wonderful Catholic place. If you are able to visit Walsingham, please do, and say a prayer to Our Lady for us all. Next Saturday I shall be sixty-five (all day).
