Dear Parishioners.

I am pleased to say the new Lectionaries have arrived and it is good to hopefully protect them in the years ahead. As I mentioned in a previous newsletter, I would like to invite contributions to help to cover the cost of these various tomes and I have put together a form for those who would like to have their name or intentions included on a text. For the altar there are four volumes. Volume one is for Sundays and Feasts, volumes two and three for weekdays and Saints and volume four covers votive Masses. There is a slightly smaller chapel edition for use at school or services outside the church. This also has four volumes.

I have purchased a Book of the Gospels to replace the existing copy which will become obsolete when we begin the new translation on First Sunday of Advent. There will be a study edition for the clergy which we will keep in the presbytery.

The People's Mass Book will be what we shall use for the parishioners. This will replace the current edition. I have ordered one hundred of these at £4.95 a copy. Plus, three large print versions and dust jackets. Over a period of three years, we will build up our stock. I plan to put a sticky label into the inside of the cover and if anyone would like a special intention to help to cover the cost of one book this would be much appreciated. There will be six separate books to cover the three-year cycle of readings as we have now. If you gave £30 this would cover the cost of all the books used in a three-year cycle. I have looked at all the options available and overall, this works out as the cheapest. I have put together a form to complete if you would like to help to purchase a book and have the name of a loved one remembered and prayed for the next 50 years. So, it is quite a good deal in this respect.

I still need one or more parishioners to volunteer for our Catechism Class. This is for one hour on a Saturday morning from 11am to 12noon. If you have a free hour, I know I can say that you will get more out of this far than you put in.

This coming Friday 1st November is the Feast of All Saints. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Mass Times are at 10am in the morning and 7.30pm in the evening. The following day is the Feast of All Souls and there will be one Mass at 10am on Saturday morning.

The local Catholic parishes of St Geroge and St Teresa, St Augustine, Our Lady of the Wayside, Blessed Robert Grissold and Olton Friary are the members of the new cluster. The Archbishop wants us to focus on how we can work together. We are planning a SWOT analysis: Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats. Being still relatively new to the parish I would welcome your thoughts.

It has crossed my mind that we might have a parish magazine. Would anyone like to help? We have many interesting people, lost of events and occasions, our school connections,

former parishioners, new parishioners and so on. Too much for the weekly newsletter. I was thinking of three editions a year.

I hope you all enjoy the half term holidays.
