29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners,

Last Friday morning when I opened the curtains in my bedroom there was a thick morning mist outside as the sun was doing its best to clear the air for the new day. The signs of the season of Autumn are all around us now as the leaves are falling like gentle rain and the trees are reaching their height of beauty with the colours of the gold, orange, red and yellow which tell us that the season of growth is coming to an end. Soon the trees will stand with bare branches while the weather blows out the broken wood. I love the seasons of the year and even in the wintertime when there is no visible growth the dormant world is waiting and preparing for the spring.

Just as the seasons provide the clear scenery for our lives so too we cannot be blind to the world around us. The various wars, battles, bloodshed in the Middle East and Ukraine. In my newspaper I noticed a picture of aid agency workers dealing with the victims of another rocket attack and on the next page pictures of a fashion event in Paris. The two events could not have been further apart.

Similarly our own country is now debating the law on assisted dying. It is terrible to even contemplate such a possibility. That our medical profession geared to save life and manage pain will be required to offer this alternative. A visit to the doctor in some future date would be to discover that the practice could no longer afford the care we need and had I ever considered assisted dying? Oh dear.

The Right to Life Charity has a website a letter prepared for you to sign and send to your MP. I've sent my letter. We can annotate the letter or personalise it but the purpose is to inform our MP that we are not in favour of this or any proposal to take away the life of a fellow human being.

Cardinal Vincent Nichols has written an excellent letter – please read it as it covers all the points. On the reverse is a poster and QR Code for the Right to Life website and a letter to your MP.

There are many other matters which ought to be discussed but probably won't be. Palliative care is one, care of the elderly is another and the management of pain. The NHS doesn't provide care for the elderly – it is provided by local authorities and privately. This is a travesty and has been not only swept under the carpet but kept under the carpet for years.

Our hospices are run and funded by Charities. The NHS has no involvement with the hospice movement. Hospices need more support. See and support the hospice charity shops and initiatives. The NHS did provide a way of "care" called the "Liverpool Care Pathway" it was anything but care because patients were denied water and died of thirst. It was appalling and now thankfully it has been stopped.

As we see in our seasons, life and death is part of our lives. The beginning and the end are as important as each other. But when someone ends a life before its due date this is not our choice and we should not impose it.
