# ST. GEORGE & ST. TERESA CATHOLIC CHURCH DORRIDGE 17th November 2024

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend has the title of Safeguarding Sunday. As a church our priority is for everyone to feel safe and be safe. Last Wednesday about 70 priests and deacons attended a compulsory day at St Chad's cathedral which was presented by our Diocesan Safeguarding team. I found the day to be informative and helpful with plenty of good advice and examples of good practice for our community. Our Parish Safety Representatives are Sandy Walmsley and Daphne Morgan. Their contact details are on this newsletter every week, on the noticeboard and website.

The end of the year is next weekend and the following week we shall have our new translation of the Catholic Bible. The books will be on display throughout the weekend and they will be blessed at the 10.30am Mass on Sunday morning. You can look but don't touch. The existing books must be at least 50 years old. Thank you to those who have offered to pay for one or more sets of the books we shall use for our Sunday Masses. Each book has a dust cover to protect it. The dedications will be put into the books in due course. Donations for the People's Mass books are going quite well but we are still £1625 short of total cost of the books. In preparation for the introduction of these new texts there will be a meeting for all readers at Mass, weekdays and Sundays, next Saturday afternoon at 2pm in the church.

A few weeks ago I circulated a letter from Cardinal Vincent Nichols concerning the Catholic view against assisted suicide and assisted dying. I included information how to contact your MP (via the Right to Life website) The forthcoming Bill has its first reading on November 29<sup>th</sup> so there is still time to contact your MP. Lord David Alton has provided an information leaflet/card for parishioners to send to your MP. These are available on the table in the Narthex. There is also an excellent article from the Catholic Herald which I have printed for you, collect from the Narthex.

Next Sunday, Christ the King, is the last of this liturgical year. It is like reaching the top of the mountain and so we celebrate this achievement before the start of Advent the following week. At the 10.30 am Mass two of our parishioners will receive the Ubi Caritas Award for assistance in the production of the weekly Ethnic Chaplaincy Sermon which is on the Diocesan website. Monsignor McHugh will be presenting the awards to Ian Morgan & Damien Walmsley at this Mass and there will be light refreshments in the hall afterwards. At the time of writing, I hope there will be a short presentation about Youth Ministry in this parish.
